WELCOME

Cllr Haines welcomed everyone to the assembly and outlined the agenda for the evening.

1. MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH MEETING HELD ON 21st April 2016

The Minutes of the Annual Parish Meeting of Dunsfold held on 21st April 2016 were received, confirmed as a true and correct record and signed by the Chairman, Cllr Steven Haines. Proposed Bob Lees; seconded Jack Woodward.

2. REPORT ON PARISH COUNCIL ACTIVITIES DURING THE PAST YEAR

Cllr Haines reminded everyone that the KGV was a very unused village asset and urged people to use it in order to make it a viable community asset.

He also announced that the play area regeneration team had held several fund raisers over the year and had raised £3k towards the new play area scheme.

Cllr Haines reported that the Parish Council are working with the Joint Parishes to fight against the Dunsfold Park planning application.

He thanked all of the Councillors for their continued hard work and looks forward to working with them in the coming year.

3. REPORTS FROM SURREY, WAVERLEY AND VILLAGE ORGANISATIONS

Cllr Young gave an update on Surrey County Council. Cllr Gray gave an update from Waverley County Council. Cllr Jones gave an update on the Local Plan, Dunsfold Park and the Neighbourhood Plan. There were also updates from the School Trustee, Shop, Church, Speedwatch, Horticultural Society, KGV, Bootcamp, DADS and the Bonfire committee.

4. REPORT OF THE SMITHS CHARITY

To receive for confirmation the Statement of Accounts of the Smiths Charity for the year ended 31st December 2016. The Chairman reported that the balance in hand as at 1st January 2016 was £632.16 plus the amount of the 2017 grant of £3600 making a total of £4232.16 available for distribution. Grocery vouchers to the value of £100 exchangeable at the Dunsfold Community Shop Association Ltd, Dunsfold had been issued to each of 36 villagers. A total of £3490.57 was distributed and £19.80 spent on postage leaving a balance in hand at 31st December 2016 of £721.79.

The adoption of the Statement of Accounts for the Smiths Charity were received, confirmed as a true and correct record and signed by the Chairman, Cllr Steven Haines. Proposed John Gray; seconded Richard Woof.
