#### How to report a crime or incident

Our neighbouring counties have seen a rise in theft of tractor GPS recently. Although we are yet to see any similar reports in Surrey, our farmers and landowners have been victim of this costly theft. This has been a difficult enough harvest season with the weather so please protect yourself and your livelihood from theft with the following tips:

Remove your GPS where possible and store securely overnight using a secure cabinet, tool storage unit, or safe.

Activate PIN security on GPS kit with your own unique number.
Use a forensic marking or etching kit and apply visible warning labels to show that the GPS unit is marked.

Record serial numbers, take colour photographs of the GPS unit from various angles, including identifying markings. This will help us track or identify your GPS unit if it is stolen.

Keep tractors and combines hidden out of sight when not in used, preferably in a locked barn.

If you have home security cameras, smart doorbell or dashcams, and have noticed any unusual activity such as someone looking in vehicles or scoping out your address, you can submit the footage via our suspicious activity portal:
